Franklin Central Band Boosters Financial Policies

The Band Boosters work very hard to keep fees as low as possible and to work with families suffering financial hardships. The Band Boosters developed the following financial policies with the best interest of the band program, students, and parents in mind.

- If a student's participation with an ensemble is terminated, all monies collected or fundraised will remain with the Band Boosters. Any outstanding fees for the ensemble must be paid in full.
- All previous fees must be paid in full or made current in accordance with their financial agreements before a student can participate in future ensembles/groups.
- All fees are due in accordance with the ensemble's established payment schedule.
- Delinquent accounts may be sent to collections. A fee of 33% will be added by the collection agency.

Show Hosting Requirements

The Band Boosters at Franklin Central High School host many events throughout the year, such as Winter Guard contests, Winter Percussion (IPA) contests, and a 2-day Winter Guard International (WGI) Percussion Regional. Groups from all over the country participate in these events, with attendance exceeding 5,000 guests. This generates ***TENS OF THOUSANDS OF DOLLARS*** for the Band Boosters! Help is required to put on these prestigious events to help make out-of-pocket fees as low as possible.

NON-Marching band families must volunteer for one shift at any event we host during the school year.

Marching Band families must volunteer for the number of shifts outlined in their Marching Band Agreement form.

Hosting shows prevents the need to hold "door-to-door" fundraisers on a nearly constant basis.

Hosting shows throughout the year REDUCES the amount of time we spend fundraising.

Hosting shows reduces fees for ALL band students by HUNDREDS of dollars.

To put it simply...we LOVE hosting shows!

Expectations

1. BE PROFESSIONAL. This is the most important expectation in the band program. It encompasses everything we do during individual practice, rehearsal, and performance. This includes supporting each other's musical training and holding yourself to a standard of excellence in the community at all times.
2. RESPECT YOUR INSTRUMENT/EQUIPMENT. Keeping your equipment in good working order is paramount to creating good sounds. Failure to properly maintain your equipment nullifies any attempts to perform in a professional manner. Keep your equipment clean, store it appropriately, and have all necessary repairs made in a timely manner.
3. RESPECT YOUR FACILITY. This is your school. Franklin Central is *extremely* fortunate to have a state-of-the-art music facility. All students, parents, and staff are expected to pick up after themselves and store equipment in the proper location. Storage areas in the band area will be used for band equipment only. Personal items will not be stored in your band locker outside of class or rehearsal time. The only items permitted in a rehearsal setting are those required for rehearsal.
4. RESPECT ONE ANOTHER. Showing respect for one another at all times is critical to our growth and success. During rehearsals and performances, do not worry about anyone other than yourself. Showing respect for each other and each other's personal property is a priority.
5. LEARN YOUR MUSIC/WORK. Students are expected to prepare their work during personal practice time outside of rehearsal. Failure to do so hinders our growth and success.

The following are examples of what it means to be professional:

- Be **ON TIME**. "To be on time is to be late. To be early is to be on time."
- Be prepared for rehearsal. This includes having the proper materials and a positive attitude.
- Remain quiet during rehearsal. This allows those being addressed to focus on improvement.
- 99% of the time, a reply of "Yes" or "No" is more than adequate.
- Practice at home...NOT DURING REHEARSALS. "Amateurs practice until they get it right...professionals practice until they cannot get it wrong."
- Always mind what you say when representing the band. Profanity is NOT tolerated.
- Extend respect to those outside the band. Leave a positive impression about the band and the school.
- Kindness can have the most profound impact of all. If you have nothing nice to say, keep it to yourself. If you will brighten someone's day...say it!

Disciplinary consequences for all band program activities, whether extra-curricular, co-curricular, or curricular, will adhere to the FCHS Student Handbook

Extra-Curricular Code of Conduct

A major purpose at Franklin Central High School is to establish a climate in which all students are able to learn with a minimum of disruption and interference; consequently, all students at Franklin Central High School are expected to behave in a way that does not disrupt or interfere with the education of fellow students. Furthermore, the Franklin Central High School band program offers students an extensive and diverse offering of extra-curricular programs. As such, higher standards of behavior are in place for students in this program to promote good citizenship as these students serve as ambassadors of Franklin Central High School for our community, state, and country. **Students who fail to meet expectations of the band program's extra-curricular activities will have consequences assessed by the sponsor or director of the activity, issued on a case-by-case basis, which may be in addition to consequences levied by school administration. Continued failure to meet these expectations, or one infraction of extreme circumstances, may result in removal from the extra-curricular activity.**

Required Equipment – Winds/Percussion/Guard

Winds

All brass and woodwind players are required to have an instrument to play during rehearsal and at home. It is the responsibility of the student to either supply their own instrument or rent an instrument from the school. The school maintains an inventory of the larger and more expensive instruments you see in a band (bass clarinet, bassoon, baritone saxophone, French horn, euphonium, and tuba). The school has an *extremely limited, or non-existent*, inventory of the following instruments, and are the responsibility of the student to acquire: flute, oboe, clarinet, alto saxophone, tenor saxophone, trumpet, and trombone.

Percussion

Franklin Central High School will provide percussion instruments, and specialty sticks/mallets, needed for our percussion students. It is the responsibility of each student to own and maintain the list of equipment provided in the "Curricular Course Information" section of this handbook.

Guard

Franklin Central High School will provide flags and sabres for all guard students. It is the responsibility of the student to provide a guard rifle. See below for a description and where to buy.

Recommended Equipment – Winds

The following lists include recommended equipment for brass and woodwind students at the high school level. These items are HIGHLY RECOMMENDED. For winds, a mouthpiece is one of the most important investments a musician can make when considering the overall sound production on their instrument. Mouthpieces are like the engine in a car. A Ferrari will not perform like a Ferrari without the proper engine! An instrument cannot have a characteristic sound without a professional mouthpiece.

The equipment we use in middle school is designed to make it easier for beginners to create music. It sacrifices the ability to make a great sound by making it easier to create *a* sound. Now that we are in high school, it is time to upgrade our equipment! An easy first step to this is upgrading the mouthpiece we use on our brass or woodwind instrument. Suggested dealers are provided for your use. See your director for more information.

Clarinets, bass clarinets, and all saxophones are expected to use **Vandoren reeds**.

Extracurricular Attendance Policies

The following policies align with Franklin Central High School Athletic Department policies.

After-school rehearsals and performances are REQUIRED for all curricular and extracurricular activities. Excused absences for an after-school event will be handled on a case-by-case basis. These must be established at least two weeks in advance and will be granted or denied at the discretion of the ensemble's director. Extenuating circumstances existing within the two-week period will be handled on a case-by-case basis by the ensemble's director.

EXCUSED absences from CURRICULAR course events will be assigned a make-up assignment. This assignment will equal or surpass the time commitment required for the missed event. Failure to turn in the make-up assignment on time will result in an unexcused absence for that event.

UNEXCUSED absences from CURRICULAR course events will result in a zero for that event's performance grade (up to 70% of the overall course grade per nine weeks). These grades cannot be made up.

EXCUSED and UNEXCUSED absences from EXTRACURRICULAR activities may result in a consequence at the discretion of the ensemble's director. Examples of these consequences include: inability to perform at the next performance, running or other physical activities, and/or removal from the activity (without refund).

Examples of excused absences:

- Funerals for a family member (documentation may be required)
- Illness/injuries (documentation by the attending physician may be required)
- Activities sponsored by the school district (accepted only with prior attempts to work around the conflict)

Examples of unexcused absences:

- Work / Homework
- Vacations
- Non-IMMEDIATE family weddings
- Family outings
- Being "grounded"
- "I couldn't find a ride."

FCHS Band/Athletics Conflict Resolution Policies

The following policies, established in 2019, have been approved by the Principal, Athletic Directors, and Performing Arts teachers. Use these policies to determine which event you will attend (the sport, the band event, or both). The official form can be found on our website. See below for an abbreviated summary of these policies.

- All involved (students, the student's family, coaches, and directors) must understand the ultimate responsibility first and foremost is for the student to communicate any scheduling conflict to his/her coach(es) and performing arts director(s) at the BEGINNING of the semester or particular activity season.
- If simultaneous activities are PRACTICES of equal priority, a meeting may be set up between coaches/directors to determine which activity to attend. Any possibility for the participant to be at both activities will be discussed.
- If simultaneous activities occur and one is for ADVANCEMENT to a higher level, all involved expect the student will attend the activity for advancement.
- If simultaneous activities occur where there are MULTIPLE events vs. one SINGLE event, all involved expect the student will attend the one single event.
- If simultaneous activities occur where both events are for ADVANCEMENT, and the student receives a GRADE for either activity, all involved expect the student will attend the event receiving the grade.
- If simultaneous activities occur and both events are EXTRA-CURRICULAR, and deemed equal per the guidelines above, THE STUDENT (AND STUDENT'S FAMILY) WILL DECIDE THE ACTIVITY.
 - No punitive consequence shall be administered by the activity the student did not choose to attend.
 - If there is a simultaneous conflict and time allows for the student to participate in both activities, the student is *always* to attend and participate in his/her other activity when possible. The student will not be required to stay at one activity to observe other levels of competition/activities in which he/she is not personally participating (ex. watching other groups that may prevent participation in both activities).

If a decision cannot be reached between the two sponsors, the building principal will make the final call.

Social Media/Media Policies

Social Media

While using *any* form of a social media outlet, please adhere to the following policies. These guidelines are designed to help our program maintain a professional and positive public image. It also helps to maintain a collegial atmosphere throughout rehearsals (in other words, it will help us avoid drama).

Keep in mind whatever is said on the internet is permanently and irreversibly available for anyone to view worldwide for the remainder of human history. This includes everything an individual deletes and posts privately.

- Band members and adults connected to the Franklin Central Bands should not make statements that could be misunderstood as official policy of the band program.
- Band members and adults connected to the Franklin Central Bands should avoid escalating drama and spreading rumors about members of the band or the band as a whole.
- Making comments promoting poor sportsmanship will not be tolerated.
- Racial, sexist, homophobic, anti-religious, and any other inflammatory content directed toward ANY individual or organization will not be tolerated.
- Harassment or threats of violence made by a student or adult connected to the Franklin Central Bands toward anyone connected to the band department or any other organization will **not** be tolerated.
- Sexually explicit comments directed toward ANY individual or organization will **not** be tolerated.

Media

Your child will have pictures taken by newsgroups, our booster organization, other booster organizations, and miscellaneous parents who unintentionally get your child in a picture while trying to take a picture of their own. These pictures may end up on news outlets and social media. This is literally impossible to prevent. Our booster group can try to prevent our own parents from taking your child's picture, but we cannot police the rest of the world. We ask you to understand this and remain calm. Some pictures taken by parents and/or our booster group may be used as a way of lawfully promoting the program via our website, official social media platforms, publicity, illustration, and advertising (concert/event programs).

Travel/Bus Guidelines

Traveling to performances inside and outside of the Franklin Central High School community is a privilege all marching band members will experience. This is not a privilege to be abused. Each band member must realize their personal behavior is a direct reflection on the band program at *all* times. All Franklin Central High School band members will follow all band, school, county, state, and federal laws while on trips.

Busing will be provided for required performances. Transportation will need to be provided by students/parents for events such as, but not limited to, solo and ensemble, miscellaneous fundraising efforts, and minor performances for small ensembles. Advance notice will be provided when busing is not available for an event.

Students must have their agreement form and medical information sheet on file to travel with the band program.

Acceptable Bus Carry-On Items:

- All items must fit in your seat
- Necessary band items for our performance
- Non-sticky snacks
- Pillow (no blankets)
- Extra clothing
- Headphones
- Bottled water

Each bus driver will ultimately determine what is acceptable for his/her bus. Each individual bus driver may disallow items deemed acceptable for bus travel by the band program.

Instrument Rental

Rental Fees

Instrument Rental \$30.00 per Semester per Instrument (*use of all percussion equipment counts as 1 instrument*)

Rental fees must be paid on time, typically within the first month of each semester, to ensure all instruments are in good-working order and proper playing condition.

All equipment owned by the school and borrowed by the student are the student's responsibility. Treat this equipment as your own. Loss or damage to this equipment due to neglect and/or carelessness will be repaired or replaced at the student's expense. Band programs are extremely expensive to operate and maintain. Students should be aware of and considerate of the fact that they are *allowed* to use school-owned equipment.

1. Students are responsible for all repairs due to neglect and/or carelessness.
 - a. Signs of neglect and/or carelessness are obvious to the trained eye. The band director and our primary instrument repair vendor, Paige's Music, will make all final decisions regarding what is deemed neglectful and/or careless damage.
 - b. Neglect of an instrument may result in the student being denied usage of ANY and ALL band equipment for a length of time determined by the band director.
2. Instruments must be latched in their case and stored properly when not in use.
3. Any lost items from your instrument (such as mouthpieces, ligatures, percussion equipment, etc.) will be replaced at the expense of the student renting the instrument.
4. The only person permitted to play a school-owned instrument is the student renting the instrument. This includes percussion equipment.
5. Use of school-owned equipment is restricted to Franklin Central High School band activities and cannot be used for rock bands or other special activities without consent from a Franklin Central High School band director. Violation of this policy will automatically result in the student being denied usage of ANY and ALL band equipment for a length of time determined by the band director.
6. Certain school-owned brass instruments *must* be handled with gloves at all times by students. This is for the preservation and longevity of the instrument's lifespan.
7. Marching band instruments are excluded from this fee.

Individually Owned Instruments

Instrument Care

Individually-owned instruments must be in good working condition at all times. Musicians *cannot* make high-quality sounds on their instrument if it is not in good working condition. Any damage or normal wear and tear must be tended to as soon as possible.

Liability

The school does not insure any privately owned equipment against loss, theft, and/or damage. We advise you to take out insurance on your instrument through a personal insurance organization in the event of loss and/or theft while the instrument is in use or stored at school. Be sure to keep a record of the make and serial number of your instrument and keep it in a safe place.

Instrument Locker/Storage Rooms and Locks

Students will be assigned a locker or cubby for their classroom materials. The contents of each locker or cubby must be limited to the equipment necessary for class/practice. When not in use, instruments and/or equipment must be in their assigned space. Equipment must be properly stored and, if applicable, LOCKED when not in use. Students using unassigned lockers or cubbies or caught sharing these spaces may lose the ability to store items in the building. It is HIGHLY RECOMMENDED that students purchase and use a lock if their space is lockable.

Uniform Guidelines

Wearing our ensemble's uniform comes with a sense of pride, tradition, and excellence. For this reason, we must treat our uniforms with respect. Please do YOUR PART to keep our uniforms in great shape.

- When in public, students are to be in full uniform. This includes coats being fastened properly and wearing or holding shakos (hats) in the correct manner.
 - Any alteration to this policy will be made on a case-by-case basis at the sole discretion of the band director. Alterations are typically made based on the weather.
- Jewelry is not permitted while wearing our uniform. Please leave expensive items and/or family keepsakes at home for safekeeping.
- Fingernail polish and make-up is prohibited while in uniform (moderate mascara and eyeliner are okay).
- Eating and drinking (except water) while in uniform is prohibited.
- Charges WILL be assessed for lost and/or damaged uniform parts.
 - Uniforms are extremely expensive. Handle them with care!
- Color guard uniform guidelines may vary year-to-year depending on each season's uniform. The color guard director will determine these guidelines with approval by the band director.

As a representative of Franklin Central High School and the community as a whole, it is imperative that our behavior and appearance is nothing short of the highest demeanor. This includes non-natural hair color (pink, green, yellow, etc.).

Acceptable appearance will ultimately be determined, without question, by the ensemble director.

Drug, Alcohol, and Controlled Substance Policy

Use or possession of any tobacco products, alcoholic beverages, controlled substances, and/or drug paraphernalia is strictly prohibited and will be grounds for dismissal from the band program. Students found with these substances will be referred to the Franklin Central High School Guidance Department for rehabilitation. Furthermore, immediate notification will be made with parents, school administrators, and the proper authorities. Use of any illegal substances on a long trip will result in the student being sent home at the expense of the student's parent(s) and/or guardian(s).

Varsity Letter Requirements

General Policies

Families may purchase a letter jacket at any time. The band program does not facilitate the purchase of a letter jacket. FCHS Band Program patches and letters are awarded at the end of each school year and are free for families. Other miscellaneous patches are available for purchase throughout the year from their respective organizations (ISSMA, IHSGCA, IPA, IBA, WGI, etc.).

Earning Patches

GRADUATION YEAR	Awarded by earning 5 points through band program participation (see below).
BAND LETTER/ CHEVRONS	Awarded by earning 15 points through band program participation (see below). Students will earn an additional chevron for each additional letter earned.
FCHS ENSEMBLE PATCHES	Earned by completing one full season with an ensemble. Fees must be paid in full.

Earning Your Letter

Students letter in band by earning 15 points through participation in the band program. Students will earn an additional chevron for each additional letter earned. Students will submit a worksheet toward the end of each school year to track points earned. Points are earned once the event has reached full completion. Submitting false information may result in the inability to earn additional points for the remainder of that student's time in the FCHS Band Program.

Class Fees

Semester Fee = \$30 per Student per Semester

This fee will cover entrance fees for the ISSMA Organizational Festival, ISSMA Solo & Ensemble State participation (not District), travel expenses, instrument maintenance costs, compensation for guest clinicians/conductors, and other miscellaneous expenses incurred throughout the school year. This fee is separate from student fees assessed by the school district (the school district fee is used strictly for music purchases) and instrument rental fees (please see the "School-Owned Instruments" section for more information).

Class fees must be paid on time, typically within the first month of each semester.

Grading Policies

- for ALL curricular band program courses -

Performances / Repertoire Assessments

Performances are mandatory and occur outside of the school day. On-Time attendance, proper attire, mature behavior, and proper performance etiquette are required to earn full points for Performance grades.

Repertoire Assessments will assess progress on performance-based material. Repertoire Assessments may occur in-class or via recorded submissions. Students must be able to submit recorded submissions via Canvas. Miscellaneous Assignments include any additional work not considered

Mastery Checks

Mastery Checks will assess progress on the fundamental aspects of the course material (scales, rhythm patterns, rudiments, etc). Mastery Checks may occur in-class or via recorded submissions. Students must be able to submit recorded submissions via Canvas.

Class Participation / Miscellaneous Assignments

Class Participation starts at 100% for each student. Students will lose points if they are not prepared for class, preventing ensemble success, and/or not maintaining a professional rehearsal etiquette. Examples of infractions are as follows:

- No instrument/music folder/music/pencil
- Not having the correct equipment (reeds, valve oil, etc.)
- Disrupting class (talking without permission, disruptive behavior, failure to pay attention, etc.)

Miscellaneous Assignments will occur periodically throughout the school year. These assignments may include but are not limited to: performance reflections, recording analysis, listening activities, music worksheets, and eLearning assignments.
